She told me that would never happen in the US. That the law is very clear and strict in this matter.

And I trust her, so I must remember not to carry any knock off products in my backpack when I go to visit her in the US.

Although... Besides those books I don't really have anything that can be considered illegal. So I think I'll be fine.

(And I don't get rid of them because they are still books, and it's not their fault that they were born as illegal copies)

Did you know that about Ecuador?

If not, you just learned something interesting today.

If yes, how did you learn that? Did you buy anything that you shouldn't?

Don't worry, I won't accuse you to anyone.
